

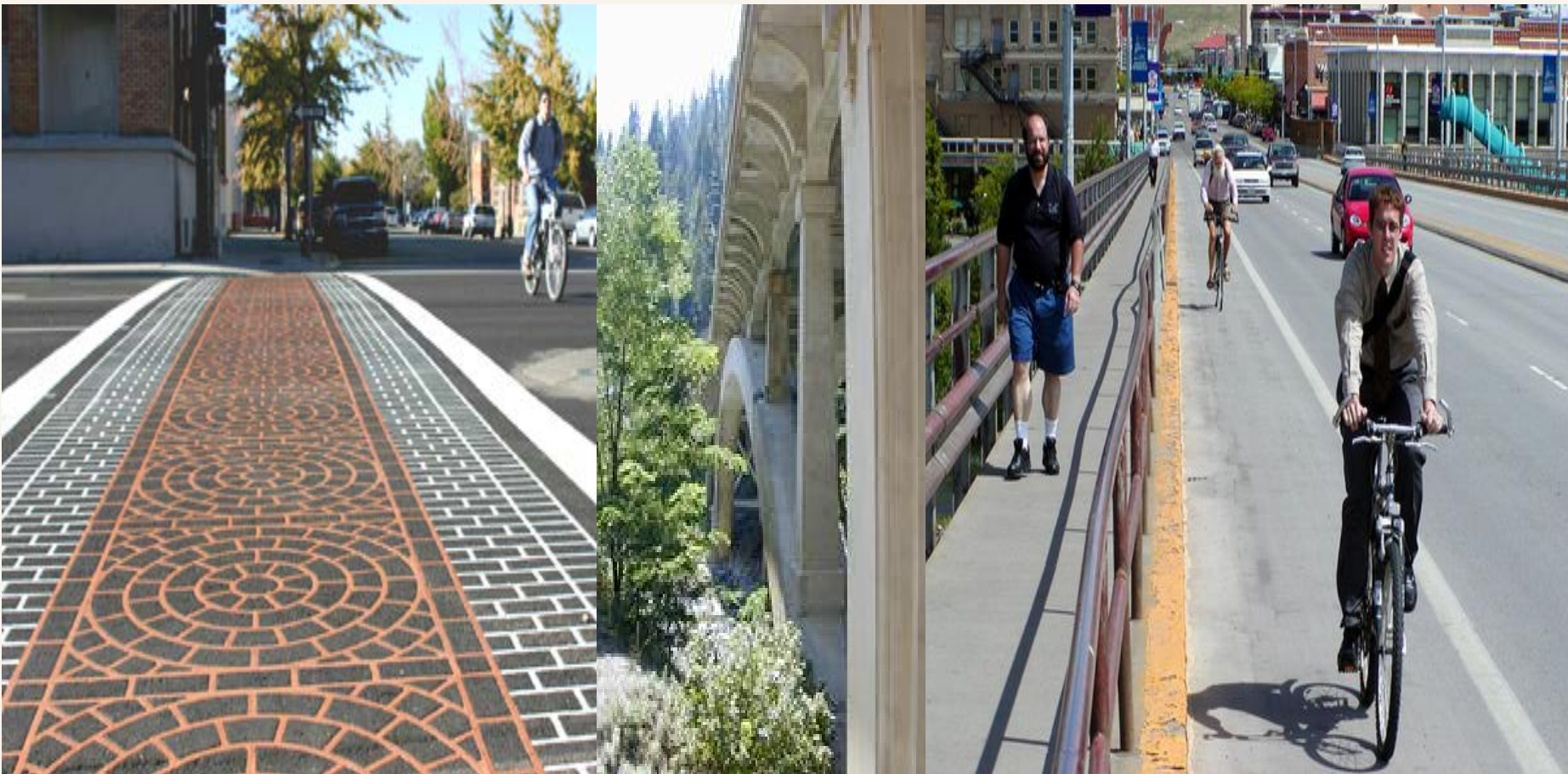

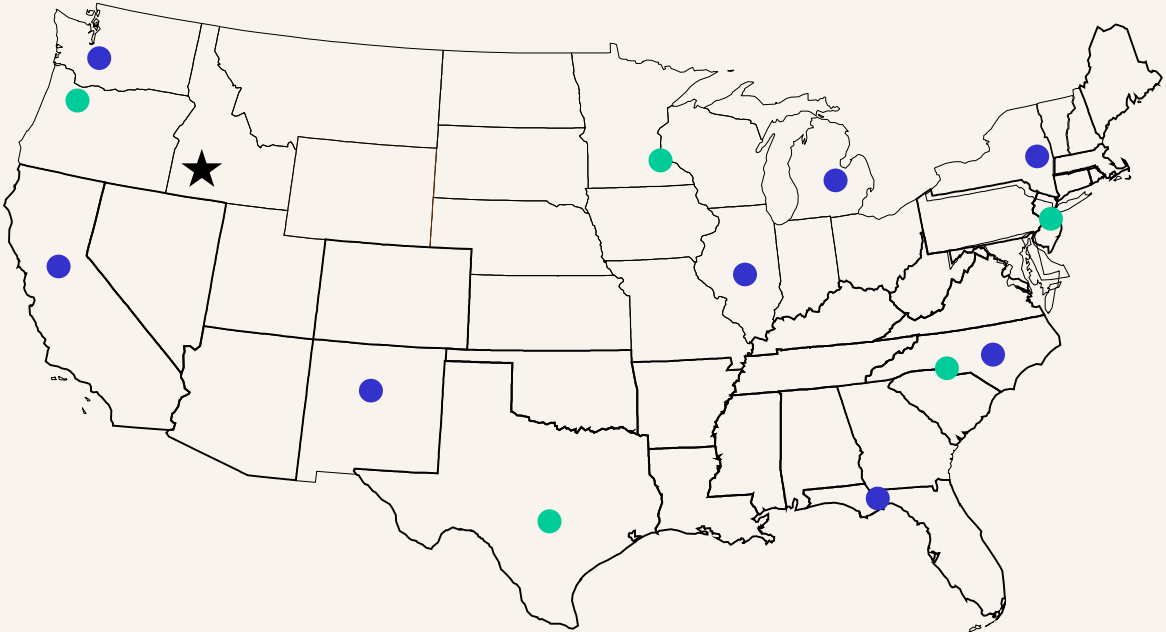

The first CSS National Dialog –

collected over 90 exemplary case studies from across the country. Five regional workshops were convened where the best practices of applying CSS in transportation projects, plans, and programs were presented and used to initiate discussion and interaction among workshop participants.

The current CSS National Dialog –

Includes a similar approach and highlight the linkages between CSS and sustainability, livability, striking a balance between needs and affordability, as well as the value of CSS for improving all phases of the transportation decision-making process, from planning, to design, to construction, to maintenance, and performance evaluation,.
